1960s

Production of Synthetic Rubber in Japan

Petrochemicals played a vital role as industrial raw materials during Japan's postwar recovery and reconstruction phase. There was an urgent need to establish synthetic rubber manufacturing in Japan because reliance on imports left Japan vulnerable to a tight supply-demand environment.

1980s

Changes in the Industrial Structure

Electronic materials were vital to the emergence of the new computer industry and products such as electronically controlled appliances with embedded microchips, and digital communications devices. 2000s
